

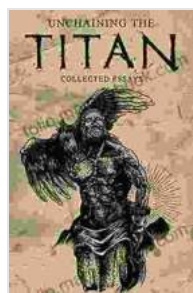
Achilleid: An Epic Poem by Paul Begadon

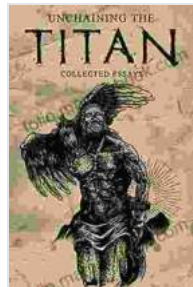

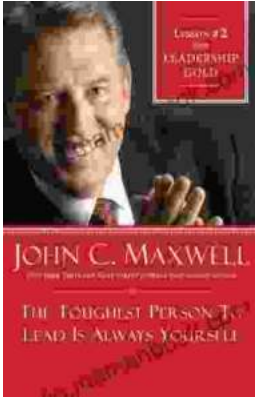
